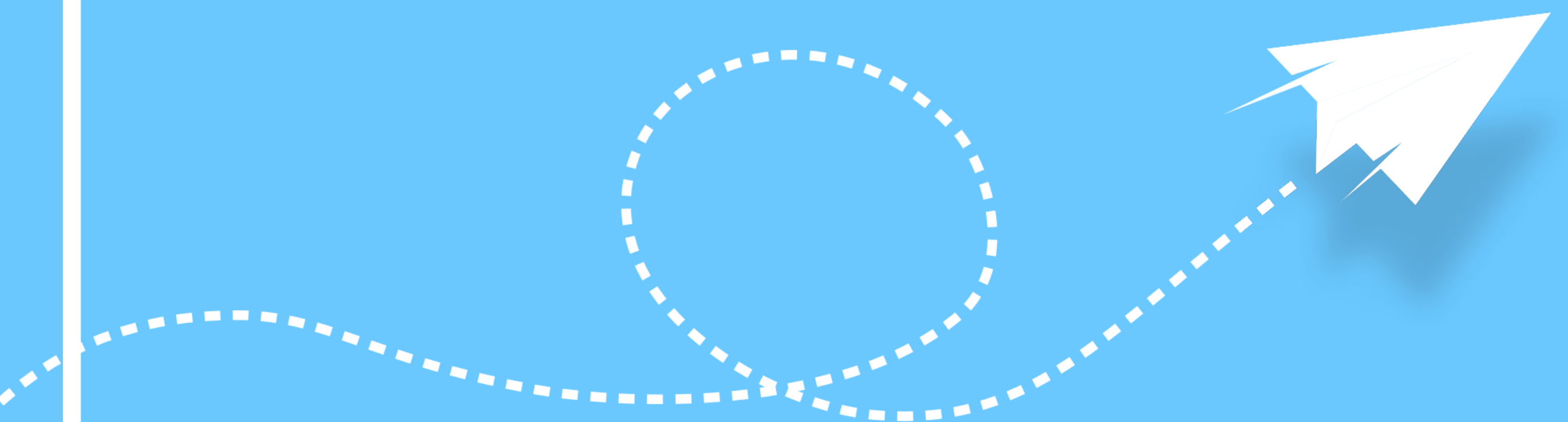

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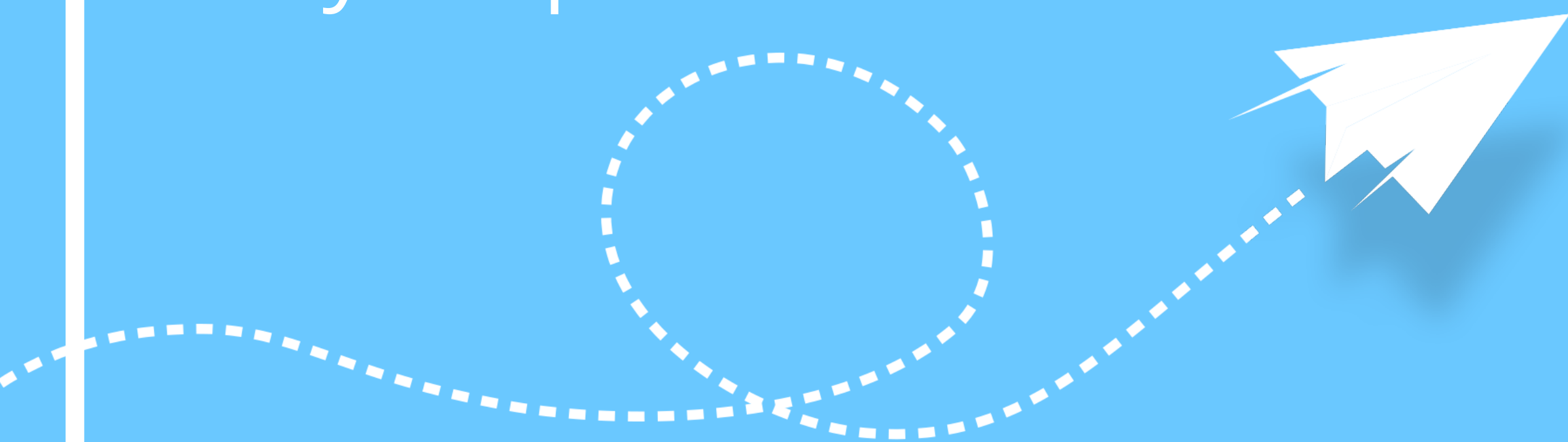

Taking your patient's pulse is one of the most common assessment methods you do. As you know, it can be very time consuming to write each and every position: that you have turned their wrist, which side you examined, and what characteristics they have.

But imagine how simple it would be to have all of these different characteristics saved into one convenient template for easy access.

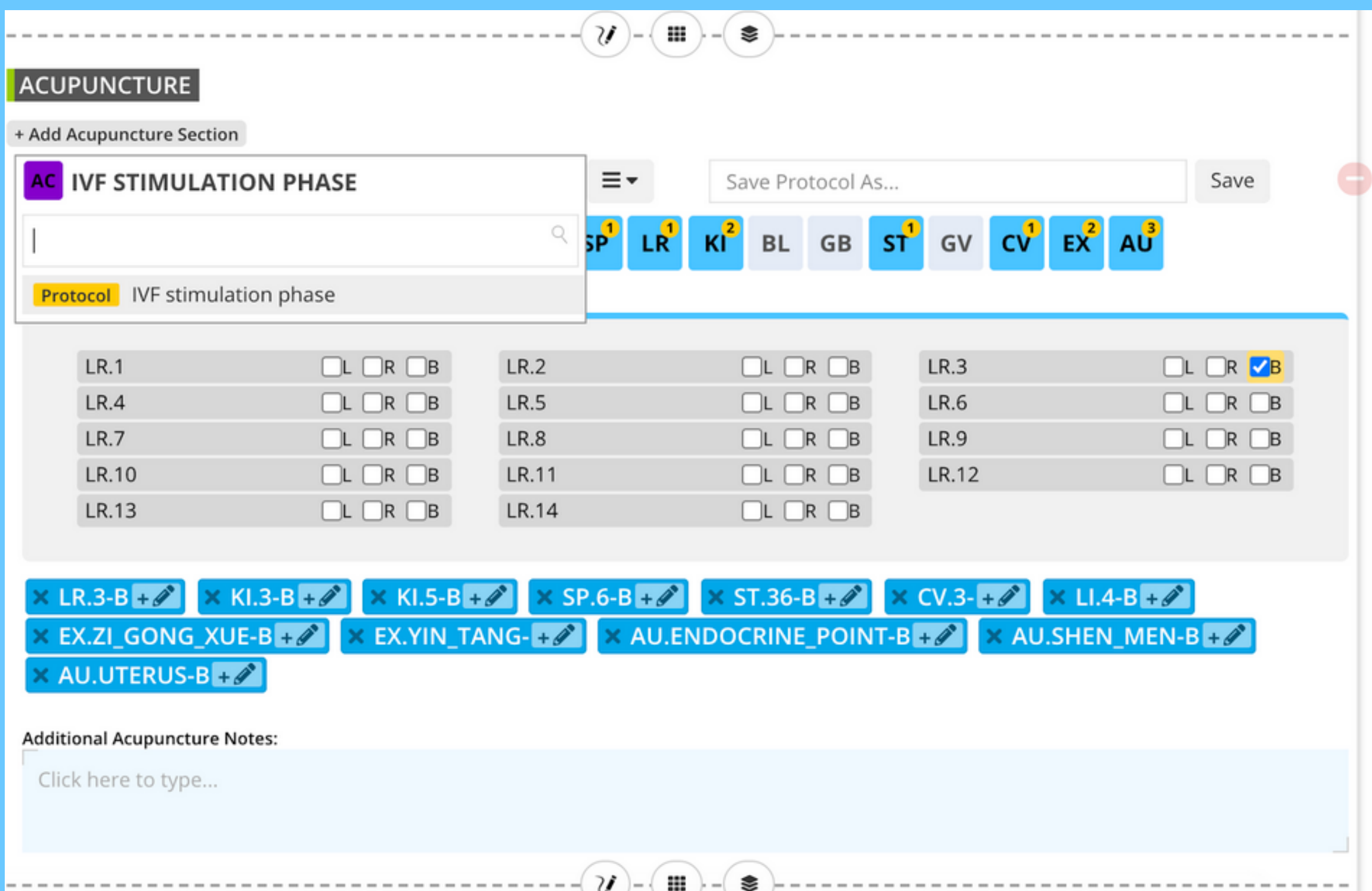

As an acupuncturist, I'm sure you can agree that having to write each and every point down and which side you addressed can be exhausting - not to mention cumbersome.

By having an *Acupuncture Points Template* within your EMR you have access to all the points you need in your custom library. With the click of a button you'll have access to a dropdown menu where you can select which set of points you used, whether it was both sides or only one side, and you can add in any additional notes.

Additionally, this can be saved as a protocol for your patient's next visit.



Speaking of protocols, an *Acupuncture Protocol* is an incredibly useful time-saving tool. It lets you save a set of acupuncture points that you routinely use for a particular type of treatment into a template, which you can add to your chart at the click of a button.

For example, let's say you are seeing a patient for IVF acupuncture. This is a situation where you might use an acupuncture protocol.

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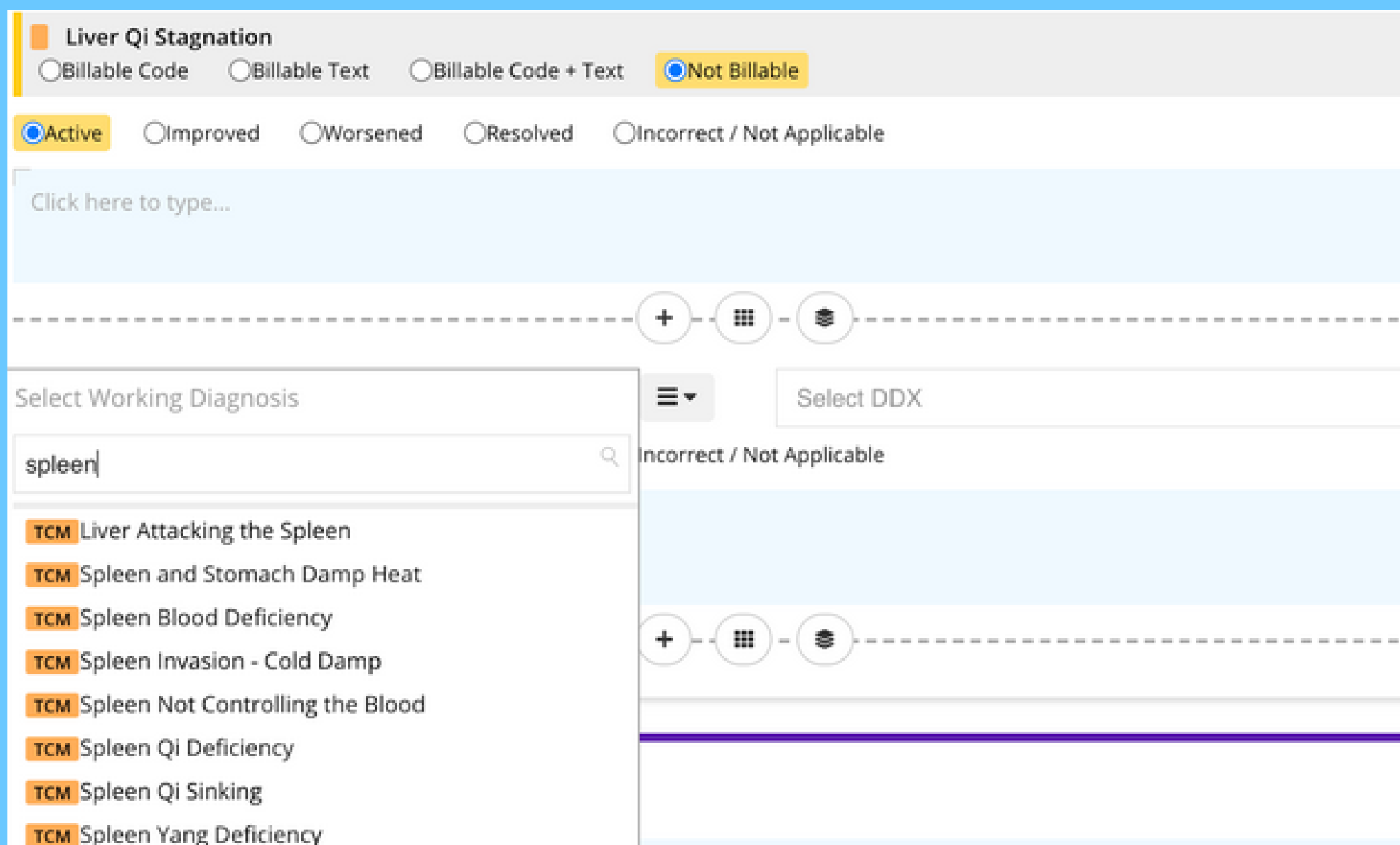
All you have to do is:

- Create template
- Name the protocol (we'll use IVF stimulation phase)
- Select the points
- Save it

And you're done! The next time you see a patient for IVF acupuncture, you can just select this protocol right from within your chart in OutSmart EMR, and modify it as needed for your patient.

Another aspect to note is that you can use *Acupuncture Protocols* from a previous chart. They can easily be copied over into the current chart for every patient visit. Changes can still be made, however it is a lot easier to modify information that is already there, than to create it from scratch every time your patient comes for their weekly acupuncture session.

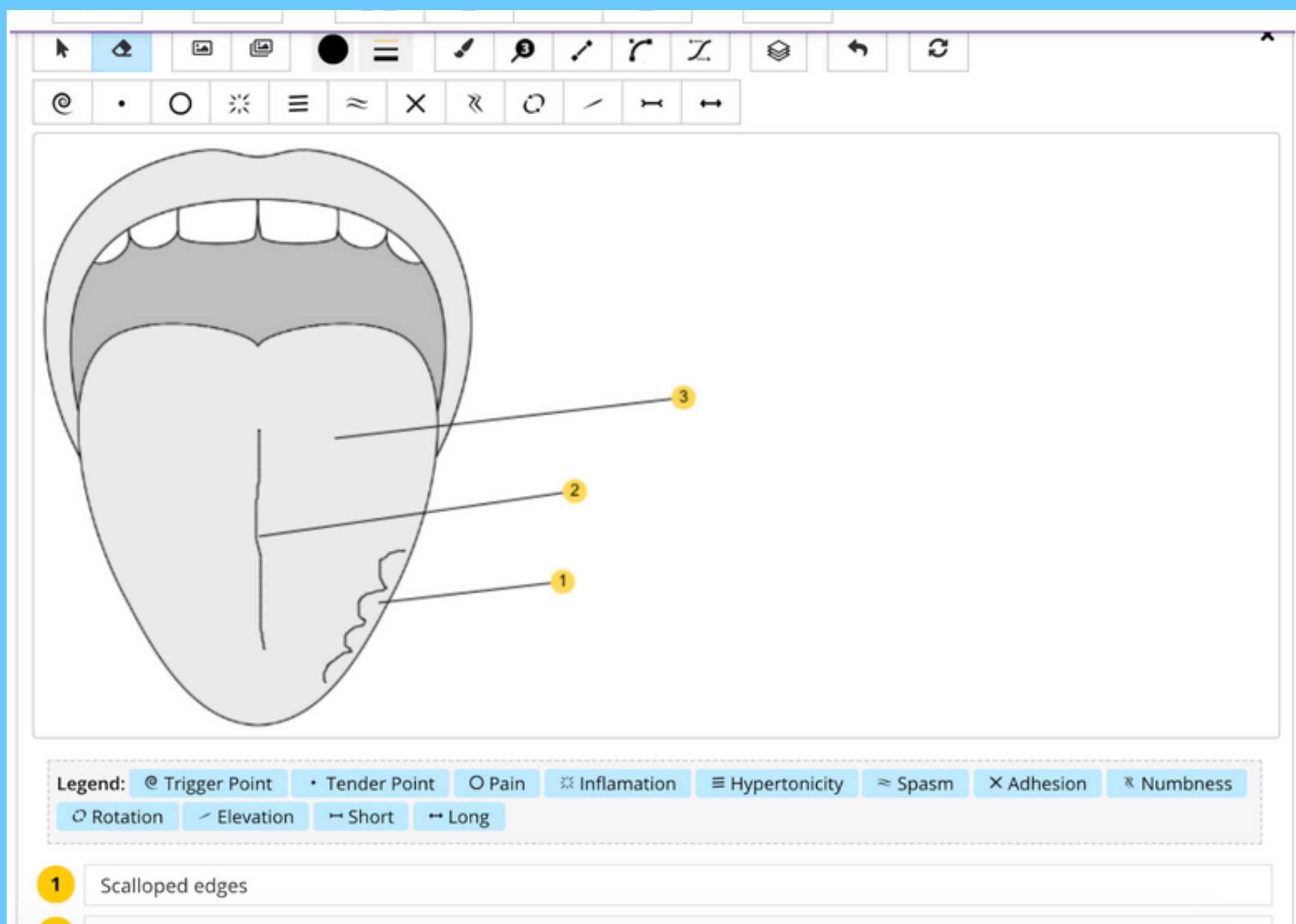
Tool #3: TCM Diagnosis List



An EMR with a *Diagnosis List* is a must when treating a patient; because it allows you to save time and chart less. Think about how simple your life will be when you have access to a library of TCM specific diagnoses required for your patients. All you need to do is begin typing the first few letters of your diagnoses and a drop down menu will appear with all the suggestions.

Depending on your diagnoses it may be incredibly specific - therefore by having a diagnosis list you are not only saving time but also being as accurate as possible.

Tool #4: Tongue Diagnosis Chart

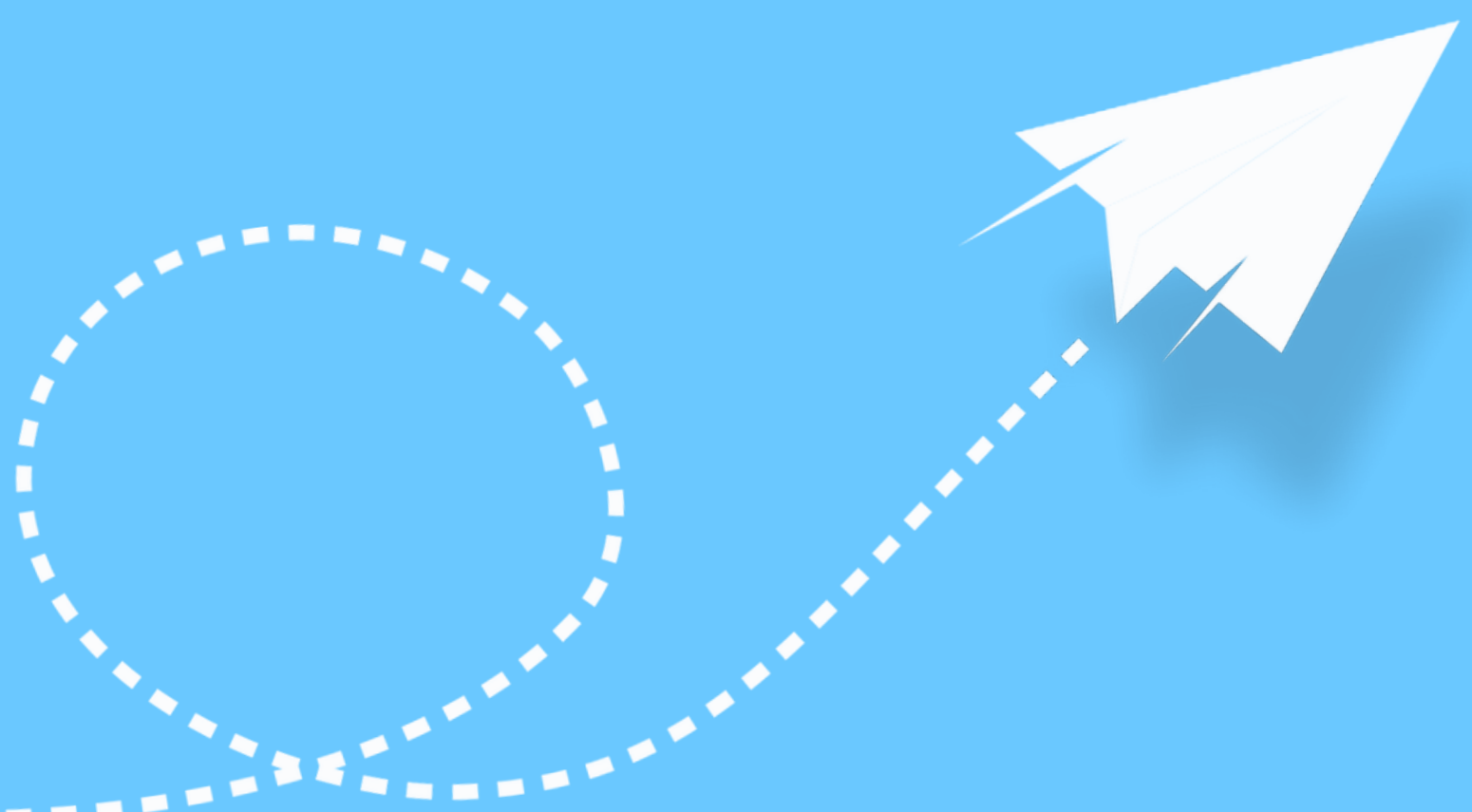


When assessing a patient, quite often you will need to look at their tongue. However, having to draw it out and include every detail is very tiresome. Imagine being able to upload images or have a pre-built template which you can draw or make annotations on.

These are the advantages of having a *Tongue Diagnosis Chart* within your EMR. It gives you free rein to put annotations on any of your images and draw freely without the hassle of papers and charts.

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This feature would be ideal and not only gives you the ability to show them visually what is going on, but also how you're going to treat them.



Tool #5: TCM Questionnaire Template
